Tennessee, and grew up in Oakland. His  
professional life reflects his varied interests. He is  
an ordained minister, and currently serves as the  
interim pastor at Palma Ceia Baptist Church in  
Hayward, California. Tommy has also written a  
book, *In Spirit and in Truth: Rediscovering the  
Message of Jesus*. Tommy began working at the  
Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory in 1979.  
He is a mechanical engineer and also holds a U.S.  
patent. Since 1994, Tommy has been the  
Laboratory's director of Diversity and Affirmative  
Action. Tommy, his wife Sandra, and two of their  
four children reside in Fremont.

**Mushim** grew up near Akron, Ohio and  
attended Baptist Sunday school when she was a  
child. As a Buddhist teacher and practitioner she  
has been called on to present at national interfaith  
conferences and services, and she is one of three  
subjects in the documentary *Acting on Faith:  
Women's New Religious Activism in America*, from  
the Pluralism Project at Harvard University.  
Mushim has practiced Buddhism both monastically  
and as a layperson and mother for almost 30 years.
