3 Spiritual Visionaries Discuss "The Dream Never Dies" 45 Years After the Assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.

A Conversation exploring the "Beloved Community" with Alice Walker, Jack Kornfield and Michael Bernard Beckwith

"It is 45 years after the death of Dr. King and the question still remains: are we any closer to achieving the ideals of the Beloved Community, where collectively hatred is countered with compassion and inequality and injustice are met with nonviolent solutions?" states Konda Mason, EBMC Board member and moderator for the event.

The "Beloved Community," a term popularized by King and a core tenant of his non-violent philosophy, speaks to an overall effort to achieve a reconciled world by raising the level of relationships among people to a height where justice prevails and persons attain their full human potential. This ideal, demanding that creating such a community "begins by loving others for their own sakes, making no distinction between a friend and enemy as it is directed toward both," will be in the minds of the presenters and a topic of discussion at "The Dream Never Dies."

In the tradition of the Civil Rights Movement, which always engaged mind, body and spirit, the evening will open with performances from Rickie Byars Beckwith, songwriter and musical director at Agape International Spiritual Center in Los Angeles, and Raz Kennedy who has been performing and recording as a vocalist, vocal coach and producer in the Bay Area since 1980.

Additional offerings include catered food for sale and a book signing with Alice Walker and Michael Bernard Beckwith.

About the Panelists:

Alice Walker is the Pulitzer Prize winning author of *The Color Purple* and more than thirty volumes of fiction, poetry, and essays including her latest book, *The World Will Follow Joy: Turning Madness into Flowers (Spring 2013)* described as a demonstration of deep compassion, profound spirituality, and necessary political commitments. She has been an outspoken activist and champion of peace for more than three decades and is also the subject of the feature documentary "Alice Walker: Beauty In Truth" directed by Pratibha Parmar currently touring film festivals around the world. Jack Kornfield is an author, peacemaker, scholar, and one of the key teachers to introduce Buddhist mindfulness practice to the West. He trained as a Buddhist monk in the monasteries of Thailand, India and Burma and has taught meditation internationally since 1974. He is also a founding teacher of the Insight Meditation Society in Massachusetts and Spirit Rock Meditation Center in Woodacre, CA. and holds a Ph.D. in clinical psychology.
